Permits the Hawaii Superferry to operate while environmental studies are being conducted; establishes a Hawaii Superferry task force in the department of transportation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii supreme court has determined that
- 2 chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that an
- 3 environmental assessment be performed with respect to certain
- 4 improvements at Kahului harbor intended for and to be used by an
- 5 inter-island ferry service between the islands of Oahu, Maui,
- 6 Kauai, and Hawaii, using harbor facilities on each island (the
- 7 "Hawaii Superferry project"), known as the Hawaii Superferry,
- 8 and that the environmental assessment must take into account
- 9 secondary effects of the Kahului harbor improvements. No
- 10 determination has yet been made as to whether an environmental
- 11 impact statement is also required.
- 12 Subsequently, the circuit court of the second circuit
- 13 determined that the Hawaii Superferry project should not be
- 14 allowed to utilize certain improvements necessary for its
- 15 operation at the Kahului harbor until the environmental
- 16 assessment and any necessary environmental impact statement is
- 17 completed. That court made other determinations as well,
- 18 including declaring that part of the harbors operating agreement

- 1 entered into on September 7, 2005, between the State of Hawaii
- 2 department of transportation and Hawaii Superferry, Inc., as
- 3 amended on October 25, 2005 ("Superferry operating agreement")
- 4 is void because it was not preceded by an environmental
- 5 assessment.
- 6 The legislature finds that the immediate operation of the
- 7 Hawaii Superferry project is in the public interest. Over the
- 8 years, the legislature has supported initiation of inter-island
- 9 ferry service and appropriated funds for harbor improvements to
- 10 facilitate the Hawaii Superferry project. The legislature also
- 11 finds that it is clearly in the public interest that the Hawaii
- 12 Superferry operate and be allowed to operate, and that harbor
- 13 improvements continue to be constructed and be allowed to be
- 14 used, while any environmental studies, including environmental
- 15 assessments and environmental impact statements, are conducted.
- The legislature also finds that it would be desirable and
- 17 appropriate for the department of transportation to prepare or
- 18 contract to prepare an environmental impact statement regarding
- 19 commercial harbor improvements undertaken to accommodate the
- 20 Hawaii Superferry project, even if such an environmental impact
- 21 statement would not be legally required. Such an environmental
- 22 impact statement should include secondary impacts of such

- 1 commercial harbor improvements, including impacts of the Hawaii
- 2 Superferry.
- 3 The legislature also finds, however, that it would neither
- 4 be desirable nor in the public interest that the operations of
- 5 the Hawaii Superferry project cease or be limited during the
- 6 preparation of any required environmental studies, including the
- 7 environmental impact statement.
- 8 The legislature also finds that it would be appropriate for
- 9 a task force to study the Hawaii Superferry project as a whole,
- 10 and to report back its findings to the legislature.
- 11 The legislature finds that in the absence of this
- 12 legislation, the Hawaii Superferry would likely cease to
- 13 operate, and the loss of the Hawaii Superferry would prove to be
- 14 a significant loss and cause very significant and irreparable
- 15 harm to Hawaii and its people. The legislature finds that
- 16 adopting a statute that unambiguously allows the Hawaii
- 17 Superferry project to operate in accord with the terms of the
- 18 operating agreement it entered into with the State, during the
- 19 preparation of any environmental studies, including
- 20 environmental assessments and environmental impact statements,
- 21 and during the review of any environmental effects, is in the
- 22 best interests of the people of the State of Hawaii.

1 The legislature has weighed competing interests, including 2 all interests served by having required environmental review and 3 studies performed prior to operation of the Hawaii Superferry 4 project, and has determined that it is in the public interest to 5 have the Hawaii Superferry project operate now, and during the 6 preparation of any required environmental review and studies. 7 Among the purposes of this Act is the purpose to amend all relevant existing laws to provide that, while any required 9 environmental review and studies, including environmental 10 assessments and environmental impact statements, are prepared, 11 and following their completion: (1) the Hawaii Superferry 12 project may operate without restriction; (2) agreements with 13 respect to its operation, including the Superferry operating 14 agreement, entered into between the State and Hawaii Superferry, 15 Inc., may be enforced or re-executed; and (3) related harbor 16 improvements may be constructed and used by the State, by Hawaii 17 Superferry, and by others. 18 The legislature finds and believes that this Act is fully 19 operative to amend existing law to allow Hawaii Superferry to 20 operate while any required environmental studies and review. 21 including environmental assessments and environmental impact

statements are prepared and following their completion,

- 1 notwithstanding the fact that the non-preparation or non-
- 2 completion of environmental assessments or environmental impact
- 3 statements would otherwise have barred, delayed, been a
- 4 condition precedent to, or interfered with such operation,
- 5 without any provision making this Act retroactive or
- 6 retrospective in operation. Nonetheless, the legislature also
- 7 finds and believes it possible that a claim could be made that
- 8 without such a provision regarding retroactivity, this Act is
- 9 ineffective to accomplish its stated ends and purposes.
- 10 Therefore, the legislature, even though it finds and believes a
- 11 retroactivity clause is not necessary to accomplish the stated
- 12 goals and purposes of this Act, has included such a clause in
- 13 this Act. However, this Act also includes a severability
- 14 clause, and so even if section 11 of this Act dealing with the
- 15 retroactive effect of this Act were somehow deemed invalid and
- 16 severed, the legislature finds and believes that the remainder
- 17 of this Act would still accomplish all of the stated purposes of
- 18 this Act, including allowing the Hawaii Superferry project to
- 19 fully operate and fully utilize state harbors and land, while
- 20 any required environmental review and studies, including
- 21 environmental assessments and environmental impact statements,
- 22 are prepared and following their completion, notwithstanding the

- 1 fact that the non-preparation or non-completion of environmental
- 2 assessments or environmental impact statements would otherwise
- 3 have barred, delayed, been a condition precedent to, or
- 4 interfered with such operation and use.
- 5 SECTION 2. Any other state or county law, ordinance, code
- 6 section, resolution, rule, quidance, or guidelines to the
- 7 contrary notwithstanding, including but not limited to chapters
- 8 205A and 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and notwithstanding that
- 9 environmental assessments and environmental impact statements
- 10 have either not been prepared or not been completed, the Hawaii
- 11 Superferry project may operate and has the right to operate and
- 12 the right to utilize Kahului harbor improvements and other
- 13 improvements and facilities on any island, pursuant to and
- 14 subject to all agreements and contracts between Hawaii
- 15 Superferry, Inc., and appropriate state agencies, including but
- 16 not limited to the Superferry operating agreement, while any
- 17 required environmental review and studies, including
- 18 environmental assessments and environmental impact statements,
- 19 are prepared, and following their completion. Except as set
- 20 forth above in this section, this right to operate conferred by
- 21 this section shall not be construed to exempt the Hawaii
- 22 Superferry project from compliance with laws of general

- 1 applicability, but shall confer the right to operate and to use
- 2 harbor facilities on any island, notwithstanding the fact that
- 3 the non-preparation or non-completion of environmental
- 4 assessments or environmental impact statements would otherwise
- 5 have barred, delayed, or been a condition precedent to, or
- 6 interfered with such operation.
- 7 SECTION 3. Any other state or county law, ordinance, code
- 8 section, resolution, rule, guidance, or guidelines to the
- 9 contrary notwithstanding, and notwithstanding that environmental
- 10 assessments and environmental impact statements have either not
- 11 been prepared or not been completed, all improvements, projects,
- 12 and facilities available for or utilized by the Hawaii
- 13 Superferry project on any island may be completed and utilized
- 14 for any purpose agreed and authorized by appropriate state
- 15 agencies while any required environmental review and studies,
- 16 including environmental assessments and environmental impact
- 17 statements, are prepared and following their completion,
- 18 notwithstanding the fact that the non-preparation or non-
- 19 completion of environmental assessments or environmental impact
- 20 statements would otherwise have barred, delayed, been a
- 21 condition precedent to, or interfered with such operation.

1 SECTION 4. Any other state or county law, ordinance, code 2 section, resolution, rule, quidance, or quidelines to the contrary notwithstanding, and notwithstanding that environmental 3 assessments and environmental impact statements have either not 4 5 been prepared or not been completed, Hawaii Superferry, Inc., 6 and the appropriate state agencies may proceed pursuant to and 7 subject to all previously executed tariffs, agreements, and contracts between the Hawaii Superferry, Inc., and appropriate 8 state agencies (including the Superferry operating agreement) or 9 may execute an operating agreement in the same general form as 10 the Superferry operating agreement previously executed, 11 12 notwithstanding the fact that the non-preparation or noncompletion of environmental assessments or environmental impact 13 14 statements would otherwise have barred, delayed, been a 15 condition precedent to, or interfered with such execution. 16 SECTION 5. Any other state or county law, ordinance, code section, resolution, rule, guidance, or guidelines to the 17 18 contrary notwithstanding, and notwithstanding that environmental 19 assessments and environmental impact statements have either not 20 been prepared or not been completed, the Hawaii Superferry 21 project is declared to be required by the public convenience and

necessity. The existing certificate of public convenience and

- 1 necessity shall not be revoked or modified on the basis that
- 2 environmental assessments and environmental impact statements
- 3 have either not been prepared or not been completed,
- 4 notwithstanding the fact that the non-preparation or non-
- 5 completion of environmental assessments or environmental impact
- 6 statements would otherwise have barred or interfered with the
- 7 issuance of such certificate, or required its revocation or
- 8 modification.
- 9 SECTION 6. Any other state or county law, ordinance, codes
- 10 section, resolution, rule, guidance, or guidelines to the
- 11 contrary notwithstanding, the construction, use, or operation of
- 12 any facilities or improvements authorized by the Superferry
- 13 operating agreement shall not be subject to or require any
- 14 county permits or approvals.
- 15 SECTION 7. Any other state or county law, ordinance, code
- 16 section, resolution, rule, guidance, or guidelines to the
- 17 contrary notwithstanding, neither the preparation of an
- 18 environmental assessment, nor a finding of no significant
- 19 impact, nor acceptance of an environmental impact statement,
- 20 shall be a condition precedent to, or otherwise be required
- 21 prior to, (1) the operation of the Hawaii Superferry pursuant to
- 22 any certificate of public convenience and necessity approved by

- 1 the public utilities commission on or before January 1, 2005, or
- 2 (2) the operation of the Hawaii Superferry between any ports or
- 3 harbors in Hawaii pursuant to any operating agreement, including
- 4 the Superferry operating agreement, or (3) the construction,
- 5 use, or operation of any improvements at Kahului harbor, or (4)
- 6 the appropriation or expenditure of any funds, the use of any
- 7 state lands, the issuance of any permits, or the entering into
- 8 of any agreements for the purpose of facilitating any of
- 9 paragraphs (1) to (3).
- 10 SECTION 8. The department of transportation shall perform
- 11 or contract to perform an environmental impact statement for the
- 12 improvements made to commercial harbors throughout the State
- 13 that require the expenditure of public funds to accommodate the
- 14 Hawaii Superferry project, and the secondary environmental
- 15 effects of those operations on the State's environment,
- 16 including of the operation of the Hawaii Superferry.
- 17 SECTION 9. The department of transportation shall make the
- 18 environmental impact statement available for public review and
- 19 comment pursuant to section 343-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- SECTION 10. (a) There is established in the department of
- 21 transportation a temporary Hawaii Superferry task force. The
- 22 department shall be responsible for administering the work of

the temporary task force, providing a facilitator, and 1 submitting reports to the legislature. The goal of the 2 temporary task force shall be to examine the impact of the 3 Hawaii Superferry including, but not limited to: 4 5 (1)Ocean life, including marine animals and plants; 6 (2) Water resources and quality; 7 (3) Harbor infrastructure for both marine and land; (4)8 Vehicular traffic; 9 (5) Public safety and security; (6) Cultural resources, including hunting, fishing, and 10 11 native Hawaiian resources; and 12 (7)Economic consequences and impact. 13 (b) The members of the temporary task force, totaling seventeen members, shall include the following: 14 The director of transportation, or the director's 15 (1)16 designee; 17 (2) The director of business, economic development, and 18 tourism, or the director's designee; 19 (3) The chair of the board of land and natural resources, 20 or the chair's designee; The attorney general or the attorney general's 21 (4)

- 1 (5) The president of Hawaii Superferry, Inc., or the 2 president's designee;
- One representative from each of the four major

 counties, including at least one representative from

 the environmental community, one representative from

 the agricultural community, and one representative

 from the general business community, each such

 representative to be appointed by the speaker of the

 house of representatives;
 - (7) One representative from each of the four major counties, including at least one representative from the environmental community, one representative from the agricultural community, and one representative from the general business community, each such representative to be appointed by the president of the senate; and
 - (8) One representative from each of the four major counties, including at least one representative from the environmental community, one representative from the agricultural community, and one representative from the general business community, each such representative to be appointed by the governor.

- 1 (c) Members of the Hawaii Superferry task force shall
- 2 serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
- 3 including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
- 4 their duties. All expenses, including travel expenses, shall be
- 5 paid by the department of transportation.
- 6 (d) The Hawaii Superferry task force shall submit a report
- 7 of its findings and recommendations to the legislature no later
- 8 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- 9 of 2009. The Superferry task force shall cease to exist upon
- 10 the submission of the report.
- 11 SECTION 11. The legislature hereby expressly declares this
- 12 Act to be retroactive and retrospective so as to be effective as
- 13 of the respective effective dates of the appropriation or
- 14 expenditure of any funds, the use of any state lands for the
- 15 purpose of facilitating the Hawaii Superferry project, the
- 16 construction of any state harbor improvements or facilities
- 17 relating to the Hawaii Superferry project or used by Hawaii
- 18 Superferry on any island, the approval of the certificate of
- 19 public convenience and necessity for Hawaii Superferry, Inc.,
- 20 the issuance of any tariffs for the purpose of facilitating the
- 21 Hawaii Superferry project, or the entering into of any

•	agreements, including the superfierry operating agreement, for
2	the purpose of facilitating the Hawaii Superferry project.
3	SECTION 12. If any provision of this Act, or the
4	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
5	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
6	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
7	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
8	of this Act are severable.
9	SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
10	retroactive to the effective dates referred to in section 11.
